VIII. Peggi Hurley Ancient Art Tattoo was our Featured Presentation:

Peggi 's presentation started with her growing up in Rehoboth Beach & then it took a brief journey thru the changes in her life & her 25-year tattoo career. After winning National Tattoo Association's "Best Tattooed Female" in 1986, she worked towards combining her fabulous tattoo with high fashion, through photography. This resulted in books, magazines, posters, videos, and a secure place in the history of tattoo by being a part of an exhibit in the American Museum of Natural History in New York City. International travel & competitions followed, as did Ancient Art Tattoo Studio in Florida. A reputation was earned for being one of the "early" lady tattooists. This was considered a very unusual profession for a woman, at that time.

In 1994, Peggi moved Ancient Art Tattoo Studio, Inc. to her hometown. She was part of the Body Art Task Force, involved in writing regulations & state laws with the Delaware Health Department. Permanent make-up, as well as custom designs of all kinds, is part of the unique services offered by the talented staff at Ancient Art! Walk-ins & visitors are always welcome!
